CHAINSAW SAFETY

Lecture & video presentation on safe handling and operating procedures of chainsaws. Hands-on participation is required for certificate.

AERIAL RESCUE AND ELECTRICAL HAZARD AWARENESS (AR&EHA)

Lecture & video training, field demo, written exam, (Aerial Rescue Participation testing Optional and electrical “table top”) live demo.

CPR & FIRST AID TRAINING CPR RE-CERTIFICATION EDUCATIONAL DAY

Each of the above courses is usually held during the Arboriculture I or II courses. Full single day seminars and are open for individual enrollment. Please check for C.E.U. credits that may be offered for attended courses.
